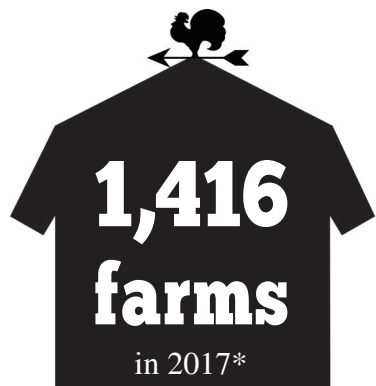

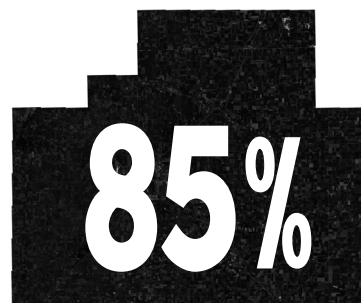

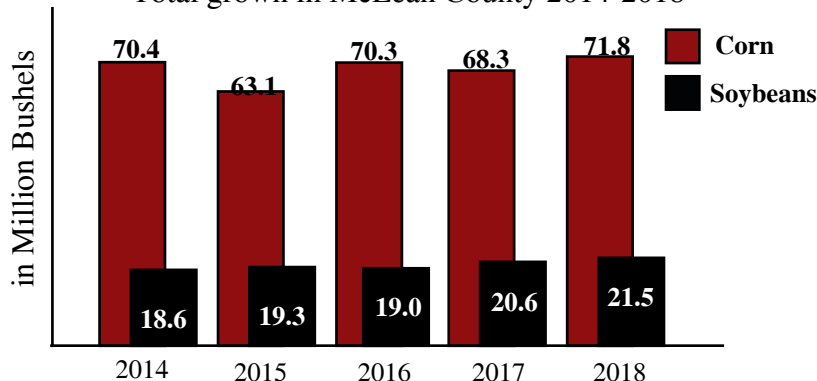

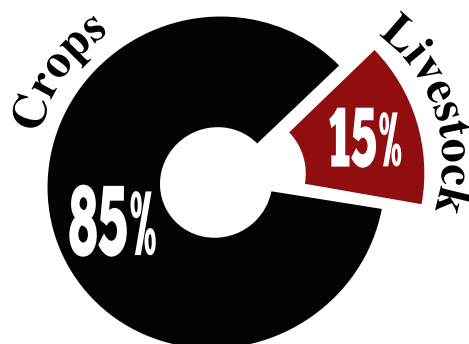
Top Crops: Corn & Soybeans
