#### **Grant Guidelines**

### **Description**

McLean County Farm Bureau® Foundation offers special funding to support Agricultural Education programs at high schools that teach McLean County Youth. Eligible schools:

- Blue Ridge
- El Paso-Gridley
- Heyworth
- LeRoy

- Lexington
- Normal Community
- Normal West
- Olympia

- Prairie Central
- Ridgeview
- Tri-Valley

## **Service Project Matching Requirement**

FFA Chapters must match grant requests with FFA student volunteer hours. Student volunteer hours will be matched at a rate of \$10 per hour (100 hours = \$1,000). The maximum grant per chapter is \$1,000. To be eligible for the full \$1,000:

- 1. Chapters must contribute at least 15 hours of volunteer hours at the Food & Farm Fun Zone during the McLean County Fair (equivalent to \$150).
- 2. Remain hours (up to 85 additional hours) may come from **other ag-related/community volunteering** (up to \$850).

Chapters that do not meet the full 15 hours at the Food & Farm Fun Zone will be eligible for a reduced grant amount based on the total verified volunteer hours from each category.

### **Grant Program**

- Grant funds must be used for ag education purposes (computers, equipment, shop equipment, programs, conferences, classroom needs, etc.)
- Up to \$1,000 will be available for each high school during the Matching Grant program year (August through April). Grant payments will be issued after December 1, 2025.
- Schools must submit the Grant Request online on or before **May 1, 2026** at www.mcfb.org/grants
- Funds may not be used for food, parties, awards, or fundraising activities greenhouse plant sales count as fundraising activities.
